INTRODUCTION

The Montgomery County Municipal Court was established by the State of Ohio on July 1, 2010. This Court is the successor court to the County Court of Montgomery County which was established in 1952. That court was the successor court to the Township Justices of the Peace prior to 1952. The Justices of the Peace were laymen elected by each township to act as part-time judicial officers. The County Court was comprised of attorneys elected throughout the area of the court's jurisdiction to serve as part-time judges. The County Municipal Court has downsized by attrition from five part-time judges to two full-time judges. We now have one full-time judge that sits on the bench in New Lebanon (Western Division) and one full-time judge that sits on the bench in Huber Heights (Eastern Division). We also have one part-time Magistrate who hears the civil docket in both the Eastern and the Western Divisions.


THE PRESENT COUNTY MUNICIPAL COURT JUDGES ARE:

Jurisdiction and Organization


The County Municipal Court serves four townships and eight municipalities in the northwest and northeast portions of Montgomery County.

The County Municipal Court Western Division in New Lebanon serves the cities of Trotwood and Brookville; the townships of Clay, Jackson, Jefferson and Perry; and the villages of Farmersville, New Lebanon, Phillipsburg and Verona. The County Municipal Court Eastern Division in Huber Heights serves the cities of Huber Heights and Riverside.

County Municipal Court also serves the other law enforcement agencies that file cases from within these jurisdictions such as the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office, Ohio State Patrol, Ohio Park Rangers, Ohio Division of Wildlife, Public Utilities Commission Police, Montgomery County Zoning, Public Health District of Dayton and Montgomery County, Animal Resource Center, Municipal Department of Taxation and the Board of Liquor Control.

The County Municipal Court has jurisdiction in all adult traffic and misdemeanor cases occurring in the court's jurisdiction. They are also the originating court for felony filings for preliminary hearings. The court has jurisdiction in civil cases up to \$15,000 and jurisdiction in small claims cases up to \$6,000. The court has a full-time Community Control Department responsible for supervising defendants. The Clerk of the County Municipal Court is the elected Clerk of Courts of Montgomery County.

Court Personnel

The County Municipal Court, Western and Eastern Divisions, are staffed by two full-time elected Judges (James D. Piergies and William C. Cox), one part-time Magistrate (Jeffrey D. Slyman), elected Clerk of Courts for Montgomery County (Mike Foley), one Judicial Manager (Amy Weimer), one Judicial Coordinator (LaJuana Curington), one Chief Community Control Officer/Bailiff (Dean A. Johnson) and four full-time Community Control Officers (Taylor Shelton, James Hayes, Jr., Lesley Riley and Sean Mitchell) three full-time bailiffs (Dean Johnson, Kristi Cox and Joseph Russell), four part-time security/service bailiffs (Mark Bruns, Michael Rotterman, David Reed, and James Gebhart), and two part-time judicial/community control assistants (Kellen McCoy and Wyonna Chenault).

Community Control Department

The County Municipal Court Community Control Department has supervisory responsibility for individuals whom the court places on community control. The Community Control Officers monitor the individuals for compliance with the law, completion of drug and alcohol treatment, batterers' education, theft education, anger management, community service and other requirements ordered by the Court.

The Community Control Department is responsible for preparing pre-sentence investigation reports, expungement reports, accepting restitution payments, performing drug screens, scheduling revocation hearings, and establishing ignition interlock.

The court placed five hundred (500) individuals on Community Control in 2022 and six hundred nineteen (619) individuals were successfully terminated. The Community Control Department prepared fourty-three (43) pre-sentence investigation reports and four hundred sixty-four (464) expungement reports.

Case Load

During the calendar year 2022 County Municipal Court processed fourteen thousand five hundred and eighty three (14,583) cases comprised of twelve thousand nine hundred and twenty eight (12,928) new case filings from local jurisdictions and had one thousand five hundred and eighty three (1,655) cases that were reactivated. The new case filings may include multiple charges and does not include parking tickets. The following charts summarize the case load of the Administrative Judge and the Individual Judges for 2022.

PUBLIC DEFENDER'S OFFICE

The Montgomery County Public Defender's Office provides valuable legal defense services to individuals who cannot afford to retain their own attorney. In 2022 the Public Defender's Office represented a total of two thousand seven hundred and seventy-six (2,776) individuals in the County Municipal Court. Of those two

thousand five hundred and sixty-four (2,564) were new case filings from local jurisdictions, one hundred and ninteen (119) cases that were reactivated.

SUMMARY

The goal of the Montgomery County Municipal Court is to provide judicial service to those citizens who are required to utilize the courts' services. While the court primarily services citizens of Montgomery County, we touch the lives of many people who travel into Montgomery County or have business dealings therein. Although providing these services is important, we strive to meet the extraordinarily high standards which are set by the Second District Court of Appeals, the Ohio Supreme Court and the U.S. Supreme Court. The court provides an impartial forum to all citizens regarding criminal, traffic and civil cases.

The essence of any organization is the people who toil day-to-day to serve the citizen. In that respect our court is fortunate to have employees who are dedicated to this goal and who have achieved a high level of competence.

Fourteen thousand five hundred and eighty-three (14,583) cases passed through the court either in civil, criminal or traffic filings. This range includes cases which were reactivated by the court due to some action by the defendant, i.e. expungements, etc. The Supreme Court has time guidelines which mandate all Ohio courts to report any case which exceeds their requirements. This record is a tribute to the hard work and attention to detail from the Judges, the judicial staff and the Clerk of Courts' staff. All court employees strive to ensure that each citizen who is touched by this organization leaves with the belief that their case has been heard and that they were treated fairly and with dignity.

All of us at the court express our gratitude for the support of the Montgomery County Commissioners and their staff. Without the help of these dedicated county workers we could not achieve the high level of efficiency which is a hallmark of Montgomery County. Our hope is that this positive working relationship will continue and that this partnership will be a benefit to the community we serve.
